### INTERNATIONAL CLUB

Saturday, August 27th the International Club of Saguaro High School met with the other International Clubs from the other 4 high schools in the district and Notre Dame Preparatory at SCC for a conference on leadership. Our officers: Teal Reinhardt, President; Ella Azizula, Vice President and Christine Chaple, Secretary/Treasurer spent the morning working with the other officers in defining their leadership roles of the individual clubs. Morgan Lightburne was selected to be our representative for the Junior Board. It was sponsored by Sister Cities of Scottsdale and Scottsdale Community College International Club. The college international students put on an international fashion show that showcased their individual countries and national dress. Lunch was provided. The summer's leadership activities were presented in panel form by those students who participated in the State Department's tri-lateral gatherings of students from Canada, Mexico and the United States. Some met here in Phoenix, some traveled to Canada or to Mexico and some even to Washington D.C. The afternoon ended with each club making a presentation of what the individual goals for the new school year were of each club. It was fun and re-energizing to see old friends and make new friends.

### SCOTTSDALE SISTER CITIES ASSOCIATION

The Sixth Bi-Annual Scottsdale/Swiss Student Ambassador Exchange will take place October 8-22, 2011. Interlaken, Switzerland has been a Sister City to Scottsdale since 1999, when the first school-to-school exchange began with Saguaro. Students from Scottsdale will have a true cultural exchange with their Swiss hosts by living with a family for two weeks and attending school there. They will attend classes taught in an English immersion program, and present topics about Arizona, Scottsdale and Scottsdale schools to English and social studies classes. During free days, the students will travel to nearby parts of Switzerland, such as the Capital, Bern, and the Top of Europe, the Jungfrauoch. The Swiss students will return to Scottsdale April 7-23, 2012 to live with their host families, attend school in Scottsdale, and see local sights including Old Town Scottsdale, the MIM, and the Grand Canyon.

For the 2011-2012 exchange, in-depth interviews and selections were completed October 2010, with monthly educational training programs held each month for one year to prepare students for their role as Ambassadors of Scottsdale. Chaperones include Anne Marie DuFour from DMHS, Cindy Foss from Saguaro, and Aaron Abbott from Arcadia.

Past exchange students report that they have maintained life-long relationships with their host brothers and sisters.
